“ Tom Thompson posted a condolence My condolences and prayers to the Bradford family. I never had the pleasure to meet Frank Bradford, I only know of him from some of the photos my father had from his time in WWII. My father Sylvan Thompson served with Frank in the 763rd Tank Bn, attached to the 96th Infantry Division in the South Pacific. They fought on Leyte in the Philippines and then later in the invasion of Okinawa. About 15 years ago or so when going over these WWII photos with my father, he recognized Frank, but couldn't remember his last name. I always wondered who this "Frank" was and what his story was. I could tell from the photos he was kind of a "take charge type of guy". He was usually shirtless, carrying an M1 carbine, but it was the look he projected which distinguished him from the others. And let it be clear that the South Pacific battles were fiercely fought with great cost on our side. But it was Frank and his generation which stepped up and met the challenge and put everything on the line...and they won it! And to Frank I give a salute and pay my respects. May he rest in peace and may his family take great pride in his service and accomplishments. God bless you and may He give you peace in this time of loss and sorrow.
